## Syllabus for Commerce Master's

## Section 1: Subject Knowledge

Please Note: A Total of 40 Questions will be asked, combining the following topics, with the difficulty level commensurate to a Master's Candidate.

Unit I: Business Environment and International Business

Concepts and elements of the business environment, Globalisation, Foreign direct investment and Foreign portfolio investment, Theories of international trade, Government intervention in International trade, Tariff and non-tariff barriers, India's foreign trade policy.

Unit II: Accounting and Auditing

Basic accounting principles; concepts and postulates, Partnership Accounts, Independent financial audit; Vouching, Verification, Audit of financial statements and audit reports, Cost audit, Recent Trends in Auditing.

Unit III: Business Economics Demand analysis, Consumer behavior, Law of Variable Proportions, Cost Theory, and Market Structure.

Unit IV: Business Finance

Capital structure, Working capital management; Dividend decision, International financial markets and instruments, Multinational capital budgeting.

Unit VI: Banking and Financial Institutions Indian financial system, Types of Banks, Reserve Bank of India, Digitisation of banking and other financial services banking.

Unit VII: Business Management and Human Resource Management Organizational structure, Human resource management, Personality, and Organizational Culture.

Unit VIII: Marketing Management Marketing, Product decisions, Pricing decisions, and Promotion decisions.
