Section 1: Subject Knowledge

Please Note: A Total of 40 Questions will be asked, combining the following topics, with the difficulty level commensurate to a Master's Candidate.

Unit I: Corporate Finance

Capital Budgeting, Capital Financing, Return of Capital, Dividend Distribution, Time Value of Money Bonds and Stocks and Valuation.

Unit II: Financial market and debt market

EMH, Alternative Investments, Financial Markets, Financial Instruments, New Financial Instruments, Financial Institutions, and Financial Services.

Unit III: Marketing

Marketing, Strategic marketing planning, Market segmentation, targeting and positioning, Product decisions: Concept, Product line, Product mix decisions, Product life cycle, New product development.
